RECIPE Sweet Potato Cake

2 cups cooked-mashed sweet potatoes
1 tsp vanilla extract
1/2 cup honey
4 eggs
1/2 cup vegetable shortening
3 cups unbleached all-purpose flour
2 tsps baking powder
1/2 tsp baking soda
2 tsps ground cinnamon
1/2 tsp ground nutmeg

(1) Preheat oven to 350 degrees.
(2) Grease a 10" tube pan
(3) In a large bowl, beat together the sweet potatoes, vanilla, and honey until well blended. Add the eggs, one at a time, beating 1 minute for each

egg. Add the shortening and beat until well combined.
(4) In another bowl, mix together the flour, baking powder, baking soca, cinnamon, and nutmeg.
(5) Slowly add the flour mixture to the sweet potato mixture. Beat on slow speed until combined.
(6) Pour the batter into the prepared pan. Bake for 60-70 minutes.
(7) Cool the cake on a wire rack.
(8) Cut into thin slices; store in refrigerator or freeze.

To cook potatoes, wash, peel and cut them into quarters. Boil for 25 minutes then mash.

Research at the American Psychological Association has shown that the average dog has the same developmental abilities as a human toddler. They can recognize approximately 165 to 250 words, as well as understand gestures, signs, and symbols -- and they can even count to five.
